CHRISTIAN FRIENDSHIP

A while ago, I came across 1 Samuel 18 in my personal Bible reading. It tells the story of the close friendship between David and Jonathan. Verses one through four are particularly noticeable, "As soon as he had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul. And Saul took him that day and would not let him return to his father's house. Then Jonathan made a covenant with David. because he loved him as his own soul. And Jonathan stripped himself of the robe that was on him and gave it to David, and his armor, and even his sword and his bow and his belt."

It strikes me that friendships like that are incredibly rare in modern culture. People are so busy running from one thing to another that we seldom make time for others. We have even lost the category for close friendships, especially among men, and we are more impoverished for it.

Christians should take cues from the Bible and not from culture. We should pursue deep and lasting friendships. Let me suggest three key components to deep Christian friendship from 1 Samuel 18: common convictions, common mission and sacrifice.



At first glance, David and Jonathan seem like unlikely companions. Jonathan was the crown prince of the Kingdom of Israel, while David was a shepherd from an family in Judah. obscure Wrong occupations, wrong socioeconomic status, wrong tribe. But Christian friendships are built around the trivialities not background or common interests. Christian friendship is based on common conviction. Jonathan and David were both men of God. A cursory glance at the story of David and Jonathan will reveal two men who strongly believed in the God of the Bible. If you want deep Christian friendships, then stand by your biblical convictions and you will discover that brothers and sisters will come to stand with you.

David and Jonathan did not keep their convictions secret. They flowed out in their words and actions. Their love for God led to a love for God's people and a deep desire to protect them from their oppressors. In other words, their common convictions led to a common mission. I can say that the closest friendships in my own life have been in ministry, the military and athletics. All were marked by a common mission. Too often our friendships are confined to common activities such as watching the game on tv. Now please don't misunderstand me, I love to watch sports but if watching a game is the foundation for you friendship, it ends with the fourth quarter or the end of the season. Friendships on mission built on common convictions remain when mutual interests fail.

Finally, be willing to sacrifice for the good of your friends. This is real Christian love. In verse 4 of our passage we read, "And Jonathan stripped himself of the robe that was on him and gave it to David, and his armor, and even his sword and his bow and his belt."

CHRISTIAN FRIENDSHIP CONT.

Jonathan recognized a man of mutual convictions and on the same mission as himself and he immediately demonstrated his commitment to the friendship by giving of himself. You see, friendship always costs something. You must be willing to give of yourself.

Jesus said in John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." In that sense, the friendship of David and Jonathan points us to an even greater friend. The Bible tells us that Jesus Christ is the friend of sinners that laid down his life in their place so they may be free from the eternal consequences of their sin and have a relationship with God. Christian friendship is not simply a good idea that is found in the Bible. Christian friendship points to the Christ of the Bible.

My genuine prayer for Faith Community Church is that we would be a community of friendships on mission, based on biblical convictions and marked by the sacrificial love of Jesus. One of the ways you can do this is plugging into a small group here at FCC! Small groups exists so we can grow together as we grow towards God. If you are looking for conviction friends to be on mission with, let me challenge you to reach out to the church office and let us help you get hooked up with a small group!



Beyond the Box

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." - 2 Corinthians 5:17

A little over a year ago, in a spiritually dark and dangerous area of Quito, Ecuador, two dirty, lost children roamed the streets. They happened to wander into the sight line of Moises, an Operation Christmas Child Regional Leadership Team Member, as he and his wife prepared for a shoebox outreach event. His heart to reach out to forgotten and marginalized children in difficult places in his city had led them to that very place. Moises went out when he saw these two boys, and invited them to come in for this very special event. These children were very dirty, clothes soiled and hair full of dust.

As Moises began to talk to them, he discovered that these children literally didn't know their own names, or even how old they were. They were living on the streets, with no identities, and no papers. For all intents and purposes, they didn't exist. Both boys accepted Moises's invitation for the outreach event, and there they met Jesus. As the Gospel was clearly presented, they gave their lives to Christ! Moises and his wife committed that day to make sure those children were cared for, and to get them papers, names, and new identities. No longer would these boys live on the streets. They had never seen a shower or a bed, and now they were safe. With government papers, these boys were able to go to school, and within one year they are now top students!



At first, they were scared to be around people, but today they run up and hug Moises and other church leaders. And both boys, transformed by Jesus Christ, believe that God is calling them to be the next teachers of the children in their church.

God gave these boys a new identity—in Christ. They have truly experienced the fullness of 2 Corinthians 5:17, that old things have passed away and now all things have become new.

The two boys' names are Javier and Luis, and those names are now written in the Lamb's Book of Life, their identity and future secure in Christ.

How can you be in prayer?

- Pray for ministry leaders as they go into spiritually dark places to host outreach events.
- Pray that children will feel seen and known by their Heavenly Father as they receive their shoebox gifts.
- Pray for those children to embrace the new identity and calling God has for them.

James 5:16 (NKJV) – "Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much."

ENCOURAGE & BUILD ONE ANOTHER UP.

1 Thessalonians 5:11 (ESV) – "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."

LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

John 13:34 (ESV) – "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another."

LOVE & HONOR ONE ANOTHER.

Romans 12:10 (ESV) – "Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor."

SERVE ONE ANOTHER.

Galatians 5:13 (ESV) – "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another."

BEAR WITH ONE ANOTHER.

Colossians 3:13 (ESV) – "Bear with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

PROVOKE & ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER

Hebrews 10:24–25 (NIV) – "And let us consider how we may spur (lit. provoke) one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

CARE TEAM

On October 1st, Faith Community Church launched a Care Team. This team is made up of many Saints with a heart for those who cannot make it into church for health/physical reasons. Our primary focus, like any ministry, is Jesus. With that said we are trying to get people to live in community with each other even if you cannot make it to church on Sunday. Some of our people are in nursing homes such as the Deerfield & St. Croix Health Center. Others are in their houses. Our job as Christians is to reflect the love of Christ to all. We put together a team that makes monthly visits with their people to read the Bible together, pray with one another, and to support each other just as the body should. Generally, our team meets with their person in week 2 or 3 of the month and then our Pastors/Elders will go and bring them communion the same week we do it here at Faith. God is doing a mighty work through this ministry and just a couple days ago I got the privilege of administering communion with a lady from The Deerfield. She shared a part of her story with me and it truly was a divine moment that ended our meeting with a hug. Generally I am not much of a hugger, (that isn't a challenge because I will hug you) but God revealed to me the beauty of touch and living presently. This hug was a hug that was "different". She finally had someone to hug. The gift of touch and true Love is of God and I know I can speak for the whole team. Thank You for trusting us to love on the Saints that can't make it to church. If you know of someone that isn't able to make it to church-Please let me know and I will reach out and connect with them.



MINISTRY TEAM





The Cheerful Giver

2 Corinthians 9:6-9

The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.
