GENEROSITY

Dear FCC Family,

In 2 Corinthians 8, the Apostle Paul brags that churches in Macedonia, "...gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord, begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints — and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us" (2 Corinthians 8:3-5).

Paul is writing to the church in Corinth about the generosity of the believers in Macedonia towards the needy saints in Jerusalem. They did all of this when, in all likelihood, the Macedonians had never met a single believer in Jerusalem. It was so shocking. It was so radically countercultural. It was also thoroughly Christian.

Generosity is a perennial hallmark of God's people in every generation. As one of the pastors at Faith Community Church, I have the unique privilege of getting to see what many don't. Like the Apostle Paul, I have a front-row seat to watch the church being the church. I get to watch the love of Jesus become visible through the actions of everyday Christians. It is truly a joy to behold! Allow me to share with you just a glimpse of what I have witnessed you do as Faith Community Church.

Over the last 6 weeks, you provided Christmas gifts to every one of the ninety students at a small Christian school in Guatemala. At the same time, you packed, prayed over, and sent 570 shoebox gifts through Operation Christmas Child. You also collected clothing for a Christian ministry to Native Americans on a reservation in South Dakota. Like the church in Macedonia, you are blessing people that most of you will never meet this side of glory.

Closer to home, you participated in compiling "Love Baskets" for families in our community that were unable to afford presents for Christmas. In total, we adopted 10 families with 28 children for the Christmas season. All of this was only possible through your kindness.

At the beginning of the Christmas season, I shared that a Christian family in town had lost their husband and father which had placed a significant financial strain on them. We read James 1:27, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world." In light of this exhortation from the Scriptures, it was then announced to the congregation that the Elders and Pastors of Faith Community Church had decided to open the "James 1:27 Fund" through the month of December. That fund was open for anyone feeling led to give to the family in need. As I write this, that fund has collected thousands! When I was informed of the amount that had been raised, I was overwhelmed and humbled at the generosity of your giving hearts to others in need.

Also, (as if that wasn't enough) during the Christmas season, our church held a "Crafts, Cocoa and Caroling" event. While this may seem like a simple get-together for fun and fellowship, it was so much more than that. Members of the church went to both care centers in town to sing Christmas carols for the residents. We even had a fantastic brass accompaniment from the Gustafson family! I cannot tell you how important this is. Many residents have few to no visitors, even at Christmas. They are often overlooked and forgotten in a world that only asks, "what can you do for me?". And yet, our church cared enough to visit and sing to them, bringing handmade crafts and the love of Christ through their kindness. I wish you all could have seen the smiles on everyone's faces! We plan to make this an annual event and would invite you to join us next year - it was an absolute blast! The beauty of having a large group is that it doesn't matter how bad you sing. You can stand with me in the back.

Finally, Pastor Chuck has been assembling a Member Care Team in order to begin to regularly visit the members of our church who have been providentially hindered from joining us on Sunday mornings for worship. The goal is to care for people who cannot leave their homes, are stuck for a prolonged period of time in the hospital, or have become residents of a care center. When they can no longer come to church, it is the responsibility of the church to go to them. We believe this is what the love of Christ calls us to.

Like I said, these are just a few of the things that I get to see and wanted to share with you. So, from the bottom of my heart, thank you! Thank you for your generosity. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Jesus.



VIDA REAL CHURCH & SCHOOL San Pablo, Guatemala

On Sunday, December 8, 2024, Pastor Antonio, accompanied by three church leaders of Vida Real, all traveled 2 hours to the village of Sipresales, Quetzaltenango, Guatemala, for service at a new church plant of Vida Real. Four families will begin this church and their excitement of having a Bible teaching church prompted them to invite many people from the community, including the mayor, to attend their first service where Pastor Antonio delivered a message from the book of Luke 19:1-8.

At a church service held in a borrowed space in Sipresales on Dec. 29, 2024, Santo Ulajuj, a new believer, shared his testimony of how his life has changed since receiving Christ. Pastor Antonio refers to Santo's salvation as "the first fruits of the work". As Santo shared, a family came forward, knelt, and began praying – perhaps praying for God to enter their hearts as well. Pastor Antonio says, "God is good, it's time to sow the seed in this place."

Pastor Antonio's prayer requests for this church plant:

- Pray for God to continue doing a mighty work amongst the people.
- For God to provide land and the provision to build a church building.

The first of its kind celebration meal was a huge blessing to the Vida Real church family's Christmas Eve service. Pastor Antonio would like to thank Faith Community Church for the kindness in providing this special meal which the adults & children loved, and a huge thank you for the gifts that were a delight to the children. You may notice from the photos that the bread was an extra special treat!



On December 31st, a service was held with unique music and many from the community accepted an invitation to attend. Pastor Antonio preached a message of "preparing the ground for the new harvest" based on Jeremiah 4:3. Once again, a special treat of bread was enjoyed by all in attendance.

Classes will begin for the faith-based school of Vida Real on January 10, 2025, with 16 teachers and an estimated 150 students in grades 1st through 6th grade. These students will be the benefactors of a loving, faith-based curriculum.

Pastor Antonio's prayer request for the church and school:

- Pray for the teachers, that their faith may be eternal, and that God may provide everything needed.
- Pray that there may be a Christ-centered education in everything.
- Pray for Pastor Antonio to be able serve well as both head of the school and pastor of the church.

PASTOR MIKE EVANS

Training Leaders International

Pastors Mike Evans, Stu Dix and Larry Szyman will begin the journey back to Gulu, Uganda on Wednesday, January 8, 2025, for the first of 3 TLI teaching sessions for 2025. This faithful team of men will begin teaching the weeklong session of Biblical education to the current cohort of pastoral students on Monday, January 13. There continues to be no shortage of African men with a desire to learn how to teach the Bible and make an impact in their communities.

Mike also shared this exciting development in Africa: Just a few weeks ago, two of the Ugandan leaders, Pastors Benson and Sunday (trained by the team from Wisconsin), traveled to Kenya to join with two TLI staff trainers to lead a "taster" event for a potential new cohort in Kenya. Mike had no concerns about the giftedness of Benson and Sunday, but all wanted to see how the Kenyan leaders would receive Ugandan trainers. During the event, Mike received a message from a TLI trainer. He said, "The leaders here are grateful an American trainer and a Canadian trainer has come. But, they are celebrating that trained Africans have come to teach them!" Plans are now being developed for a cohort in Kenya next year that will include Ugandan trainers! PRAISE GOD!

Ofu Loso:

Pastors Chandiga John, Ameku Godfrey, and the rest of the training team will take what they've learned through the TLI training into the Adjumani refugee settlements in January and February. Through support from Faith Community Church, these men will be able to give their students paper copies of this Biblical teaching. This is in addition to the Bibles FCC supplied in May of 2024. Having copies of this training will add another necessary tool for them to effectively share and teach the Bible. The pastoral students of Ofu Loso will then be able to share these valuable Bible education lessons with those in their own settlement community.

We packed two semi-trailers so full, that a U-Haul trailer was rented in December, and the "leftover shoeboxes" were delivered to Aurora by a small group of people from our area. They served with volunteers from around the country processing shoeboxes for the countries of Malawi and Jamaica on the two days they volunteered.

HOW TO EAT YOUR BIBLE:


A Simple Approach to Learning and Loving the Word of God

Over the last decade, each January, I have started a read-through-the-Bible-in-a-year plan. This has blessed me in big ways. I have grown in my understanding of the comprehensive story of the Bible, God's character, humanity's sinfulness and our need for a Savior. But, I have also noticed a tendency to forget a lot of details as soon as I walk away from my daily reading.

This year, I found myself hungering for a deeper grasp of God's Word. Something that sticks with me as I walk through my day, a help in setting my mind on the things above (Col 3:2). I want a more intense, intimate knowing of Christ. I don't remember how I picked up this book, but I am so thankful I did! In reading Nate Picowicz's book, "How To Eat Your Bible: A Simple Approach to Learning and Loving the Word of God", I found an author with a heart that mirrors my own.

Nate begins by humbly sharing his once lack of biblical knowledge and understanding that came simply out of his lack of thorough reading. He was starving himself, like so many Christians, and he felt lost. In God's providence, Nate was led to a long-term, in depth, study plan that changed how he drew near to God's Word. Instead of a quick in and out approach to verses, he began to dig in, consume the Bible with delight and ingest it for nourishment. He began to truly know the whole counsel of God in order to better know and obey God Himself.

"How To Eat Your Bible" is based on verses such as Jesus' words in Matthew 4:4, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" and Jeremiah 15:16, "Your words were found, and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart". This book is short, informative and very practical. It explains why the Bible is infinitely important, how to get the most out of your reading time and ends with a flexible program for life-long study.



I gladly recommend this book, especially for those who are intimidated by the Bible, those who don't know where to begin or even for those who doubt that God's Word is all that it says it is - "living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Heb 4:12). "How To Eat Your Bible" would also be a great companion book for those going through Pastor Patrick's discipleship book on the Bible. As the author says, "Learning to love God's Word is not just possible, it's doable".


