EVANGELISM

Dear Faith Family,

I am currently teaching an adult Sunday School class on Evangelism, and I have thoroughly enjoyed it! The Lord has really blessed me as I have sought to practice what I preach, and He has answered my prayers by giving me unexpected opportunities to tell others about Jesus.

Even as I say this, I know that may sound weird to many of you. Evangelism can be an intimidating subject. Christians know they should tell others about Jesus, but we fear what people will think of us. We worry about how they will respond and catastrophize all the things that can go wrong. We feel insufficient for the task. We lack confidence so we simply shelve the subject in the back of our minds. But, the problem is, we are looking in the wrong place for confidence.

The Christian's confidence in evangelism doesn't come from within themselves. It comes from the gospel we are sharing. In Romans 1:16a, the Apostle Paul writes, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes..." The reason the Apostle Paul is not ashamed of the gospel has nothing to do with himself. The power is in the Christ he proclaims. Jesus saves. Don't miss that!

This means that it's not my responsibility to convince people of the truth of Christianity. It doesn't depend upon my persuasive power or even my intelligence (thank goodness). The power of the gospel is the power of God! And whenever the gospel is proclaimed, that power is unleashed. God says in Isaiah 55:11, "so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it."



Let me give you an example from history that I hope encourages you. Back in the 1600's there was a famous Baptist minister in England named Benjamin Keach. Keach was from all reports a godly man, but his son Elias was not. As a young man, Elias rebelled against his father's teaching and left home on a ship bound for the New World. When he was about to arrive in the thirteen colonies, he was struck with the reality that he had no way of earning a living, and he had no money. But, what he did have, was a book of his father's sermons. So, Elias came up with a plan. He would earn money by pretending to a be a preacher. He would simply get up in the pulpit and preach his dad's sermons as if they were his own.

So, when Elias landed in America, he left the ship dressed as a minister. He traveled through the colonies pretending to be a pastor. And for a time, his plan seemed to work. Until one Sunday, as he was in the middle of preaching unsuspecting congregation, Elias to an stopped. A stunned look came over his face. He just seemed to stand there in silence until he began to tremble and weep. The congregation was afraid he was sick. It turns out that while Elias had been preaching his father's sermon on the Bible to the congregation, the power of the word of God stopped him cold. Elias confessed that he was an imposter, and his plan was to make money off his father's ministry while he was still an unbelieving sinner. And yet in his deception, the Lord had changed his heart through the sermon that he himself was preaching!

Elias became a Christian that day. Not because of the eloquence or intelligence of any person, but because the Spirit of God spoke to him through the word of God. He was convicted of his sins and his eyes were opened to behold the glory of Jesus.

Friends, don't give up hope. Take confidence in the power of God in His gospel. If God saved a fake pastor reading a stolen sermon, he can use you when you are faithful to tell others about Jesus.


ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL Schedule of Events




OTHER RESOURCES

book review


FINDING MY VOCATION A Guide for Young People Seeking a Calling

I read this book with the hope of reviewing something valuable for teens thinking about their future. What I wasn't expecting to find was a beneficial resource - not only for teens and their parents - but a book that encouraged me in my own calling and in the place God assigned me (1 Cor 7:17). In "Finding My Vocation: A Guide for Young People Seeking a Calling" by William Boekestein the author comes alongside kids to help them think biblically through the question, "As a believer, how can I determine what I am supposed to do, and then do it well?"

This book is broken into three sections:


- "Pondering Vocation" God designed work for His glory and our good, "your vocation is the unique way in which God has chosen you to fit into His great plan".
- "Preparing for Your Vocation" What can you do to better ready yourself for the future, "how you live now will add up to what you will bring to your calling later".
- "Practicing Vocation" Biblical disciplines important to your life's work such as excellence, money and rest. "Your work habits either validate or undermine your claim of faith and repentance."

Each of these sections is gospel-filled, inspiring, realistic and practical. Boekestein, using Scripture and faithful saints from the past, is able to motivate while also taking the worldly pressure and anxiety off. "As a Christian, you are not looking for fulfillment at work - you've found it in Christ. Your vocation isn't how you will find yourself - you've found yourself in Jesus". The book ends with an appendix that gives counsel on some tough questions such as "Should I Go to College?" and "Is Military Service a Good Option for Me?"



I recommend this book for teens, as young as 14. It would make a great gift! I also recommend this book for those already well into adulthood that may be struggling in their career. "Finding my Vocation" really helps put work into a healthy perspective. "You must choose a vocation. But you can trust that 'God's callings are discerned quietly, when the heart of faith joins opportunities and gifts with the needs of others'. Be committed to using your gifts. Practice faith in Christ whose righteousness gives you the freedom to work for the good of your neighbor. And trust that behind your choices is the ever-faithful working of a loving God."

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD God Is So Good...

This past week, Faith Community wrapped up its 13th year serving our nearby communities as a central drop off location for Operation Christmas Child's Western Wisconsin Area. Thirty-four volunteers served a total of 207.75 hours as they welcomed shoebox donors, counted shoebox gifts, packed shoeboxes into cartons, and loaded 700, 50 lb. cartons containing 10,817 shoebox gifts into two semitrailers.

God had a bountiful harvest planned for this season; not all the Gospel Opportunities collected would fit into the two trailers! A small group of people will travel down to Aurora with a U-Haul trailer in tow to deliver this year's leftovers and serve at the Processing Center. Where will your shoebox gift take its journey? Stay tuned to discover where your shoebox gift and the 534 shoebox gifts from Faith Community may go.

These precious shoebox gifts will serve as a tool to a local church in another part of the world to open the door for evangelism. These shoebox gifts were prayed over all along the way, including with the truck driver prior to when the trailers left FCC's parking lot destined for the processing center located in Aurora, Illinois. Once they arrive in Aurora, they will be prayed over many times; and again, at the outreach event before being placed into the eagerly waiting little hands of the wide eyed, excited children God has chosen to receive each gift.

to pack a BASBO shoebox gift. BASBO shoebox gifts are packed with a select list of items and sent in a plain red/green shoebox to countries with strict customs and regulations, and those that are sensitive/hostile to the Gospel.



Our younger church family received special visitors, Jan Hoffman and Betsy Manor, to explain what mission is and to share the "why" of Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts (Gospel Opportunties). Ask your child if they know why we send shoebox gifts (to show Jesus loves them) and ask them how our shoebox gifts travel to God's intended recipient. (Ship, camel, canoe, donkey, llama, elephant, plane, train, truck, tractor, motorcycle, bicyle, helicopter, and on foot)

FCC MEMBER Serving on Mission

Paul Warner weeks spent two of October/November in Asheville, North Carolina serving with a Samaritan's Purse Disaster Relief team. By the time Paul had arrived, the flood waters had receded, but seeing how Hurricane Helene had ravaged the land and devastated people's lives was heart wrenching. There was no shortage of opportunities to share God's love not only with homeowners, but random strangers on the street that knew the orange shirt wearing individuals were there to assist in the aftermath, and to show that they were loved and that someone cared about them

On one job assignment located up a mountaintop, he drove as far as he could and then phoned the homeowner, Christian. The road had completely washed out and Christian came down the mountain in his four-wheeler to drive Paul up the remainder of the way. Once at Christian's home, he shared how he had remained inside his house, completely frozen and unable to move from the patio door as he watched the flood waters rise alarmingly fast, eventually coming right up to the bottom of his patio door and remained there. Christian pointed out a 20' high log/tree jam left by the flooded creek, and shared how that jam had diverted the water and prevented his home from being completely washed away; which Christian believed was God's hand of protection.

When Paul returned, it was discovered that many people currently attending Faith Community may also be interested in serving on mission with future disaster relief. Watch for an informational meeting in the future.

GUATEMALA God Is Love

On Thursday, November 29, 2024, our sister church and mission partner, Vida Real Church, in San Pablo La Laguna, Guatemala, held an Evangelistic service. Pastor Antonio shared a simple message, "God is Love". (Romans 5:8-9) Antonio shared with FCC's mission team that 70 people came to faith in Christ during this service. There were lots of tears and everyone in attendance could feel God's presence amongst them.



Pastor Antonio asks for continued prayers for the growth in the spirit and understanding of God's character for Vida Real's church family, for God to raise up leaders within the church, and prayers specifically for the women within the church.

Each year, Vida Real celebrates the wonder of Jesus' birth with a special Christmas Eve service. With both believers and invited guests in attendance, Pastor Antonio will preach a specific message on "Asking Jesus into your heart". With the support of mission funds, their Christmas Eve service will include a special celebration meal. In a country where lack of food is common, this will provide a beautiful outreach event to nonbelievers and be a symbol of Jesus' love to both the Vida Real church family and their guests. We are thankful that God has provided this opportunity to share our blessings with our church family in San Pablo, Guatemala.




