# FAITH COMMUNITY CHURCH SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

#### **OPENING PRAYER**

ICE BREAKER:

What is your favorite fried food? (I do not like fried food is not an acceptable answer) Remember, there are no wrong answers. :)

**THINK BACK:** Referring back to this week's sermon... What is the BIG IDEA of the Scripture AS IT WAS TAUGHT THIS WEEK? Was there anything that left you with questions?

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Read 1 John 4:7-12. Consider the teaching so far in this series, discuss the themes that have been recurring in the letter (ex. addressing false teachers, loving your brother, pursuing each other as Jesus' pursued us, God is light, God is love).
- 2. John appeals to the church to love each other because "whoever loves has been born of God and knows God." In your own words, discuss what John is saying to the church in v7-8.
- 3. Read 1 John 4:9-10. Then read Romans 5:6-8. Two men, one God: the message of Paul and John speak to the same truth. We serve a God that pursued us in full knowledge of our condition and actively showed supreme love towards us. Share with each other about when you came to understand that God's love was shown to you through the death of His Son Jesus as payment for your sin. How are you daily and actively reminding yourself and each other of that truth?
- 4. Have you considered that to love as God commanded you is to love others personally and He personally loved you? How are you sacrificially loving the people in your life for the sake of the Gospel?
- 5. To supremely love someone is to know God, to love Him, and to love others by telling others about Him and sacrificing for them as He sacrificed for you. No part of that statement can be sacrificed as we pursue obedience to God. So how are you telling others about Jesus? How are you showing them the God that you serve? How can we do that together?

## **APPLICATION**

Think about what most caught your attention in the text or discussion. Why is God catching your attention with this at this point in your life? What does God want you to know or do? What's one thing from this text that you could say to an unbeliever about who God is?

#### PRAYER

Ask people for specific prayer requests. Pray for needs and for applications of the text. Ask for volunteers who would like to pray for those people and requests.

### SHEPHERDING

Check the roster and see who is not there. Does the group know why someone is not there? Are there needs that can be meet by the group? Specific prayer requests? Ask for someone to reach out and say, "We missed you."
